Orthodox Heresy or Heretical Orthodoxy?

Two composers featured in the second season of the "C x C" project that lauched in 2021 are Akiko Yamane and Kenji Sakai. Both are composers who studied at Kyoto City University of Arts, but it is interesting to note that their styles and musical trajectories are quite different from each other. Yamane, who deftly places her music within the context of contemporary art, appears at first glance to be a pop heretic, but her well-thought-out creative approach is exactly orthodox. One wonders how she will confront John Cage, the king of heresy in the world of contemporary music. On the other hand, Sakai, who studied in France and Switzerland at a young age and continues to be active internationally, may appear smart and orthodox at first glance, but his eager and aggressive creative attitude definitely harbors heresy. The true value of his work is sure to be tested when paired with the music of Gyorgy Ligeti, whose music is half hatred and half love. This September and next January in Yokohama, the two Japanese composers' respective music will intersect with that of Cage and Ligeti, creating an intense clash of heresy and orthodoxy. You just can't miss it!
